

## **Ukraine: Incident Management Training**

Responders deployed to deliver incident management training to people living and working close to the front line. The training focussed on trauma medicine and included the sharing of lifesaving medical skills.

## **Response headlines:**


- 5 Responders deployed.
- 114 people trained in lifesaving medical techniques.
- Medical supplies left with local groups and individuals.
- Training sessions delivered in cities along the contact line including Konotop and Pokrovsk.
- Worked with local organisations Ukrainian Education Platform and Globa22.
- Attendees included police officers, nurses, midwives, students and teachers.

## What is the situation?

The conflict that began in 2022 persists, making cities like Konotop and Pokrovsk battlegrounds, where resilient communities are determined to continue their daily lives. During this deployment, one of the volunteers due to attend the training was tragically killed as a result of Russian engagement.
